This list also includes some other forms of hypersensitivity reactions, especially so-called allergic contact dermatitis (ACD), a type-IV hypersensitivity response. Such a response is not associated with IgE action, but T-cell activation. The prototypic example is Urushiol-induced contact dermatitis. The introduction of this act was influenced by the death of more than 100 patients due to elixir sulfanilamide, a sulfanilamide medication where the toxic solvent diethylene glycol was used to dissolve the drug and make a liquid form. It replaced the earlier Pure Food and Drug Act of 1906. This bill is similar to the Food Safety Enhancement Act which passed the House in 2009. It is considered the first major piece of federal legislation addressing food safety since 1938. It is also the first piece of legislation to address intentional adulteration and Food Defense.

In technical terms, an allergen is an antigen that is capable of stimulating a type-I hypersensitivity reaction in atopic individuals through immunoglobulin E (IgE) responses. Most humans mount significant immunoglobulin E responses only as a defense against parasitic infections. However, some individuals may respond to many common environmental antigens. In atopic individuals, non-parasitic antigens stimulate inappropriate IgE production, leading to type I hypersensitivity.

Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act. The FDA's principal representative with members of congress during its drafting was Charles W. Copeland, a three-term U. senator from New York. A principal author of this law was Royal S. giving authority to the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) to oversee the safety of food, drugs, medical devices, and cosmetics. The act has been amended many times, most recently to add requirements about bioterrorism preparations. Also in that year the FDA formed the Drug Efficacy Study Implementation (DESI) to incorporate into FD&C regulations the recommendations from a National Academy of Sciences investigation of effectiveness of previously marketed drugs. In 1968, the Electronic Product Radiation Control provisions were added to the FD&C. Much of this regulatory-enforcement work is not directly related to food or drugs but involves other regulated products like lasers, cellular phones, and condoms. Risk factors include a family history of allergies, vitamin D deficiency, obesity, and high levels of cleanliness. Allergies occur when immunoglobulin E (IgE), part of the body's immune system, binds to molecules in food, usually proteins. This triggers the release of inflammatory chemicals such as histamine.
