Words that are not function words are called content words (or open class words, lexical words, or autosemantic words) and include nouns, most verbs, adjectives, and most adverbs, although some adverbs are function words (interrogative adverbs and relative adverbs). Dictionaries define the specific meanings of content words but can describe only the general usages of function words. Definition A term may have many different senses and multiple meanings, and thus require multiple definitions. Definitions can be classified into two large categories: intensional definitions (which try to give the sense of a term), and extensional definitions (which try to list the objects that a term describes). Another important category of definitions is the class of ostensive definitions, which convey the meaning of a term by pointing out examples. called the definiendum, and the word, group of words, or action that defines it is called the definiens.
