== Common names == b2e0df1bfa Ticks belong to two major families: the Ixodidae, or hard ticks, and the Argasidae, or soft ticks. Nuttalliella, a genus of tick from southern Africa, is the only living member of the family Nuttalliellidae, which represents the most primitive living lineage of ticks. Adults have ovoid/pear-shaped bodies (idiosomas) which become engorged with blood when they feed, and eight legs. Their cephalothorax and abdomen are completely fused. In addition to having a hard shield on their dorsal surfaces, known as the scutum, hard ticks have a beak-like structure at the front containing the mouthparts, whereas soft ticks... b2e0df1bfa Paralysis ticks are found in many types of habitat, particularly areas of high rainfall such as wet sclerophyll forest and temperate rainforest. The natural hosts for the paralysis tick include koalas, bandicoots, possums and kangaroos. b2e0df1bfa

Dogs in the Chernobyl exclusion zone The blasts ignited fires and released radioactive material into the atmosphere, prompting the evacuation of nearby residents within a 30-kilometer zone that later became known as the Chernobyl Exclusion Zone. Operators attempted to determine whether slowing the turbine could provide enough power to cool the reactor in the event of an outage. The resulting power surge caused fuel damage, steam buildup, and two explosions early on April 26—one from steam pressure and another likely from the buildup of hydrogen. in ticks showed a significant difference in exposures in these two locations. Ticks transmit the human strain of babesiosis, so it often presents with other tick-borne illnesses such as Lyme disease. After trypanosomes, Babesia is thought to be the second-most common blood parasite of mammals. It can have major adverse effects on the health of domestic animals in areas without severe winters. In cattle, the disease is known as Texas cattle fever or redwater. b2e0df1bfa

Ixodes holocyclus Because the same area includes Australia's most densely populated regions, bites on people, pets and livestock are relatively common. Within that range, Ixodes holocyclus is the tick most frequently encountered by humans and their pets. feeding on one female tick. It is usually found in a 20-kilometre wide band following the eastern coastline of Australia. It can cause paralysis by injecting neurotoxins into its host. The outside surface, or cuticle, of hard ticks grows to accommodate the large Ixodes holocyclus, commonly known as the Australian paralysis tick, is one of about 75 species in the Australian tick fauna and is considered the most medically important. Adult male ticks rarely blood-feed on a host b2e0df1bfa

Tick They are part of the mite superorder Parasitiformes. Ticks are external parasites, living by feeding on the blood of mammals, birds, and sometimes reptiles and amphibians. climates. The timing of the origin of ticks is uncertain, though the oldest known tick fossils are around 100 million years old, and come from the Cretaceous period. Nuttalliella, a genus of tick from southern Ticks are parasitic arachnids of the order Ixodida. Ticks are widely distributed around the world, especially in warm, humid climates. Adult ticks are approximately 3 to 5 mm in length depending on age, sex, and species, but can become larger when engorged b2e0df1bfa

Most ticks go through four stages: egg Dermacentor variabilis, also known as the American dog tick or wood tick, is a species of tick that is known to carry bacteria responsible for several diseases in humans, including Rocky Mountain spotted fever and tularemia (Francisella tularensis). The most common sign of infection is an expanding red rash, known as erythema migrans (EM), which appears at the site of the tick bite about a week afterwards. The rash is typically neither itchy nor painful. Approximately 70–80% of infected people develop a rash. Other early symptoms may include fever, headaches and tiredness. If untreated, symptoms may include loss of the ability to move one or both sides of the face, joint pains, severe headaches with neck stiffness or heart palpitations. Months to years later, repeated episodes of joint pain and swelling may occur. Occasionally, shooting pains or tingling in the arms and... b2e0df1bfa After the 1986 nuclear disaster in Chernobyl, the regional domestic dog population suffered from environmental pollution originating from the radiation. Dog Dogs were the first species to be domesticated over 14,000 years ago, before the development of agriculture, though genetic studies suggest the domestication process may have begun over 25,000 years ago. Due to their long association with humans, dogs have gained the ability to thrive on a starch-rich diet that would be inadequate for other canids. Also called the domestic dog, it was selectively bred during the Late Pleistocene by hunter-gatherers. ticks, mites, cestodes, nematodes, and coccidia. Dogs and the modern gray wolf share a common ancestor. Additionally, dogs are The dog (Canis familiaris or Canis lupus familiaris) is a domesticated descendant of wolves. Common raccoon dog Common raccoon dogs feed on many animals and plant matter, and are unusual among canids (dogs, foxes, and other members of the family Canidae) in that they hibernate during cold winters and can climb trees. Named for its raccoon-like face markings, it is most closely related to foxes. The similar Japanese raccoon dog (*Nyctereutes viverrinus*, the tanuki), native to Japan, is the only other living member of the genus *Nyctereutes*. They are widespread in their native range, and are invasive in Europe where they were introduced for the fur trade. introduction of the common raccoon dog to Europe is thought to have brought with it infected ticks that introduced the Asian tick-borne meningoencephalitis virus The common raccoon dog (*Nyctereutes procyonoides*), also called the Chinese or Asian raccoon dog to distinguish it from the Japanese raccoon dog, is a heavy-set, fox-like canid native to East Asia b2e0df1bfa

Lyme disease It is the most common disease spread by ticks in the Northern Hemisphere. Early detection and prompt treatment are associated with more favorable outcomes. Infections are most common in the spring and early summer. Most treated patients experience a full recovery. For some patients, recovery may not be immediate or complete, resulting in long-term effects. known as Lyme borreliosis, is a tick-borne disease caused by species of *Borrelia* bacteria, transmitted by blood-feeding ticks in the genus *Ixodes*. The closest relatives of the common raccoon dogs are the true foxes, not the raccoon, which is one of the musteloids, and not closely related. Among the Canidae, the common raccoon dog shares the habit of regularly climbing trees only with the North American gray fox, which is neither a true fox nor a close relative of the common raccoon dog. b2e0df1bfa Though *D. variabilis* may be exposed to *Borrelia burgdorferi*, the causative agent of Lyme disease, these ticks are not competent vectors for the transmission of this disease. The primary vectors for *B. burgdorferi* are the deer ticks *Ixodes scapularis* in eastern parts of the United States, *Ixodes pacificus* in California and Oregon, and *Ixodes ricinus* in Europe. *D. variabilis* may also carry *Anaplasma phagocytophilum*, the causative agent of human granulocytic anaplasmosis, and *Ehrlichia chaffeensis*, the causative agent of human monocytic ehrlichiosis. b2e0df1bfa Due to the fur trade, the common raccoon dog has been widely introduced in Europe, where it has been treated as... b2e0df1bfa Dogs have been bred for desired behaviors, sensory capabilities, and physical attributes.
