There are several methods for measuring eye movement, with the most popular variant using video images to extract eye position. Eye trackers are used in research on the visual system, in psychology, in psycholinguistics, marketing, as an input device for human-computer interaction, and in product design. These include those aimed at convergence insufficiency – where it is often termed "vergence therapy", "orthoptics/vision therapy"... 3263c8a124 These symptoms tend to arise after long-term use of computers, staring at phone screens, digital devices, reading, or other activities that involve extended visual tasks. Various causes contribute to eye strain, including uncorrected vision problems, digital device usage, environmental factors, and underlying health conditions. When concentrating on a visually intense task, such as continuously focusing on a book or computer monitor, the ciliary muscles and the extra-ocular muscles are strained, also contributing to the symptoms. These symptoms are broadly classified into external (related to the ocular surface) and internal symptom factors (related to eye muscles). 3263c8a124 Eyes with resolving power have come in ten fundamentally different forms, classified into compound eyes and non-compound eyes. Compound eyes are made up of multiple

small visual units, and are common on insects and crustaceans. Non-compound eyes have a single lens and focus light onto the retina to form a single image. This type of eye is common in mammals, including humans.

In higher organisms, the eye is a complex optical system that collects light from the surrounding environment, regulates its intensity through a diaphragm, focuses it through an adjustable assembly of lenses to form an image, converts this image into a set of electrical signals, and transmits these signals to the brain through neural pathways that connect the eye via the optic nerve to the visual cortex and other areas of the brain.

History

The house in which the institution resides was a donation from the Bignone family to the federal government that in turn gave the property to the municipality of Vicente Lopez to be used as a rehabilitation center for people with impaired vision. Vision therapy Neither the American Academy of Pediatrics nor the American Academy of Ophthalmology support the use of vision therapy. Most claims—for example that the therapy can address neurological, educational, and spatial difficulties—lack supporting evidence. Vision therapy has not been shown to be effective using scientific studies, except for helping with convergence insufficiency. Vision therapy (VT), or behavioral optometry, is an umbrella term for alternative medicine treatments using eye exercises, based around the pseudoscientific claim that vision problems are the true underlying cause of learning difficulties, particularly in children.
