Stéphane Miroux (Gael García Bernal) is a shy young man whose vivid dreams often interfere with his waking life. Scientific research demonstrates that inadequate sleep produces chronic consequences for overall health, ranging from attentional lapses to long-term neurodegenerative changes. Persistent sleep insufficiency can contribute to cognitive decline, emotional instability, and biological wear that has effects similar to accelerated aging. It can be either chronic or acute and may vary widely in severity. This means it can occur over both short and long periods
