Josh Johnson (pitcher) was again sidelined by elbow stiffness in July and had Tommy John ligament-replacement surgery on August 3, 2007. He played in Major League Baseball (MLB) for the Florida/Miami Marlins and Toronto Blue Jays from 2005 through 2013. John won 288 games in his career - 124 before the surgery and 164 after. Many players have subsequently undergone the surgery, some more than once. Three players (Paul Molitor, John Smoltz, and Billy Wagner) have undergone the surgery and been inducted into the National Baseball Hall of Fame. Pitcher Hong-Chih Kuo underwent the surgery a record four times before making a return to the MLB with the Los Angeles Dodgers, while Tejay Antone had three successive surgeries before making his way back to professional baseball. 703216c509 == Early life == 703216c509 Brebbia grew up in Sharon, Massachusetts, and attended Sharon High School through his junior year. He transferred to Wellington High School in Wellington, Florida, for his senior year to improve his chances of earning a college baseball scholarship. Jobe also performed the first major reconstructive shoulder surgery on a big league player in 1990, which allowed Dodger star Orel Hershisser to continue his career. "Tommy John" surgery has since become a common procedure among baseball pitchers Thomas Edward John Jr. (May 22, 1943 – August 15, 2026), nicknamed "the Bionic Man", was an American professional baseball pitcher who played in Major League Baseball (MLB) for 26 seasons between 1963 and 1989.
