Usually, two containers are collected during one draw, one of which is designed for aerobic organisms that require oxygen, and one of which is for anaerobic organisms, that do not. These two containers are referred to as a set of blood cultures. Two sets of blood cultures are sometimes collected from two different blood draw sites. If an organism only appears in one of the two sets, it is more likely to represent contamination with skin flora than a true bloodstream infection. Any degree Colic in horses is defined as abdominal pain, but it is a clinical symptom rather than a diagnosis. Colic surgery is usually an expensive procedure as it is major abdominal surgery, often with intensive aftercare. What makes it tricky is that different causes can manifest with similar signs of distress in the animal. There are a variety of different causes of colic, some of which can prove fatal without surgical intervention. Large amount of fluid can indicate acute peritonitis. Among domesticated horses, colic is the leading cause of premature death. Recognizing and understanding these signs is pivotal, as timely action can spell the difference between a brief moment of discomfort and a life-threatening situation. The term colic can encompass all forms of gastrointestinal conditions which cause pain as well as other causes of abdominal pain not involving the gastrointestinal tract. especially in large quantities, can indicate ascites or uroperitoneum (urine in the abdomen). A standard urine test strip may comprise up to 10 different chemical pads or reagents which react (change color) when immersed in, and then removed from, a urine sample. The test can often be read in as little as 60 to 120 seconds after dipping, although certain tests require longer. Routine testing of the urine with multiparameter strips is the first step in the diagnosis of a wide range of diseases.
