The primary difference between injector pens and traditional vial and syringe administration is the easier use of an injector pen by people with low dexterity, poor vision, or who need portability to administer medicine on time. insulin analogs and GLP-1 agonists for diabetes treatment are available as injector pens. Injector pens also decrease the fear or adversity towards self-injection of medications, which increases the likelihood that a person takes the medication. After injection, microcrystals slowly release insulin for about 24 hours. This insulin causes body tissues to absorb glucose from the blood and decreases glucose production by the liver. 476143325b

Dulaglutide It is also approved in the United States for the reduction of major adverse cardiovascular events such as death, heart attack, or stroke in adults with type 2 diabetes who have established cardiovascular disease or multiple cardiovascular risk factors. Trulicity is taken by giving an injection once a week under the skin of your stomach, thigh, or upper arm. The medication is a prescription that comes in the form of a pre-filled single-dose pen in 0.75mg, 1.5mg, 3mg, or 4.5mg per 5mg injection. You are able to take the dosage at any time during the day of administration with/without food eaten. The most common side effects upon administration are nausea, diarrhea, vomiting, abdominal pain, and decreased appetite. 476143325b

The most common side effects of tirzepatide include nausea, vomiting, diarrhea, decreased appetite, constipation, upper abdominal discomfort, and abdominal pain. Developed by Eli Lilly and Company, tirzepatide was approved for treatment of T2D in the US in May 2022, in the European Union in September 2022, in Canada in November 2022, and in Australia in

December 2022. The US Food and Drug Administration (FDA) considers it a first-in-class medication. The FDA approved it for weight loss in November 2023. Also in November 2023, the UK Medicines and Healthcare products Regulatory Agency revised the indication for tirzepatide (as Mounjaro) to include weight management and weight loss. Diabetes medication Other anti-diabetes Drugs used in diabetes treat types of diabetes mellitus by decreasing glucose levels in the blood. (Semaglutide is available both as a pill and as an injection.) There are different classes of hypoglycemic drugs, and selection of the appropriate agent depends on the nature of the diabetes (Type I vs Type II), the age and situation of the person, as well as other patient factors. Other anti-diabetes medications (including semaglutide as Rybelsus) are administered orally and are thus called oral hypoglycemic agents or oral antihyperglycemic agents. Most GLP-1 receptor agonists (liraglutide, exenatide, tirzepatide, pramlintide and others) are administered by injection. the blood.
