In 2015, the NCDC merged with the National Geophysical... Both for in-house operation and outsourcing, service-level agreements must be managed to ensure data-availability. Originally established in the United States (WDC A), Soviet Union (WDC B), Europe and Japan (WDC C), the WDC system expanded to other countries and to new scientific disciplines. The WDC system included up to 52 Centres in 15 countries, with some data centres replicating another. All data held in WDCs were available for the cost of copying and sending the requested information.
