Identification of pregnancy associated deaths is important for deciding whether or not the pregnancy was a direct or indirect contributing cause of the death. The CDC definition of pregnancy-related deaths extends the period of consideration to include one year from the resolution of the pregnancy. An independent study in the same year by Renew Bariatrics, a bariatric center for obesity treatment in the United States and Canada, reports 650 million adults and 135 million children and adolescents as obese worldwide. Studies suggest that if Canada invests \$4.2 billion in treatment for obesity, the obesity rate could be significantly reduced to 29%.
