Daylight saving time The typical implementation of DST is to adjust clocks ahead of standard time by one hour in spring or late winter, and to set clocks back by one hour in the autumn (or fall in North American English, hence the mnemonic: "spring forward and fall back"). Daylight saving time (DST), also referred to as daylight savings time, daylight time (United States and Canada), or summer time (United Kingdom, European Union, and others), is the practice of advancing clocks to (in theory) make better use of the longer daylight available during summer by having darkness fall at a later clock time. The time

at which summer time begins and ends is given in the relevant EU Directive and UK Statutory Instrument as 1 am. Greenwich Mean Time (GMT) 3a9756cc68

In all locations in Europe where summer time is observed (the EU, EFTA and associated countries), European Summer Time begins at 01:00 UTC/WET (02:00 CET, 03:00 EET) on the last Sunday in March (between 25 and 31 March) and ends at 01:00 UTC (02:00 WEST, 03:00 CEST, 04:00 EEST) on the last Sunday in October (between 25 and 31 October) each year; i.e. the change is made at the same absolute time across all time zones. European Union Directive 2000/84/EC makes the observance of summer time mandatory for EU member states (except overseas territories). Mission Elapsed Time The shuttles also had UTC clocks so that the astronauts could easily figure out what the “official” time aboard ISS was. For example, 2:03:45:18 MET means it has been 2 days, 3 hours, 45 minutes, and 18 seconds since liftoff. In 2019 Mission Elapsed Time (MET) is used by NASA

during their space missions, most notably during their Space Shuttle missions. This avoids the constant rescheduling of events in case the launchtime slips. Mean Time (UTC/GMT). MET was formerly called Ground Elapsed Time (GET) until the 1981 launch of the Space Shuttle. Due to the fact that timing is very consequential in a mission, all events after launch are scheduled on the Mission Elapsed Time. The MET-clock is set to zero at the moment of liftoff and counts forward in normal days, hours, minutes, and seconds

In 2019, a test flight of the Boeing CST-100 Starliner spacecraft suffered a mission anomaly through an incorrectly set Mission Elapsed Time on the vehicle. The combination of a haab' and a tzolk'in date identifies a day in a combination which does not occur again for 18,980 days (52 haab' cycles of 365 days equals 73 tzolk'in cycles of 260 days, approximately 52 years), a period known as the Calendar Round. To identify days over periods longer than this, Mesoamericans used the Long Count calendar.

Time in Finland EET is two hours ahead of coordinated universal time (UTC+02:00) and EEST is three hours ahead of coordinated universal time

(UTC+03:00). in most countries, including Finland. In October 1893, most of the railways in Europe adopted the offsets GMT (also named Western European Time), GMT+01:00 Finland uses Eastern European Time (EET) during the winter as standard time and Eastern European Summer Time (EEST) during the summer as daylight saving time. Finland adopted EET on 30 April 1921, and has observed daylight saving time in its current alignment since 1981 by advancing the clock forward one hour at 3:00 am EET on the last Sunday in March and back at 4:00 am EET on the last Sunday in October, doing so an hour earlier for the first two years 3a9756cc68

The two most widely used calendars in pre-Columbian Mesoamerica were the 260-day tzolk'in and the 365-day haab'. The equivalent Aztec calendars are known in Nahuatl as the tōnalpōhualli and xiuhpōhualli, respectively.

In many countries, the part of the year when DST is observed is much longer than the part aligned to standard time. The practice of DST was first tested and widely adopted in the early 20th century, since which many countries have abandoned DST partially or entirely.
His studies in the field of radiant heat led to him receiving the Rumford Medal of the Royal Society in 1868. In 1859 he was appointed director of Kew Observatory. He was elected professor of physics at Owens College, Manchester, and was the first holder of the prestigious Langworthy chair that he retained until his death on 19 December 1887. He was the author of several
