Food Quality Protection Act It mandated a health-based standard for pesticides used in foods, provided special protections for babies and infants, streamlined the approval of safe pesticides, established incentives for the creation of safer pesticides, and required that pesticide registrations remain current. One of the most prominent sections of the act, the specified protections for babies and infants, was the topic of the National Academy of Sciences' 1993 report, Pesticides in the Diets of Infants & Children. The EPA has cited this report as a catalyst for the creation of the FQPA. e036cc293c The key requirements of the act are that food must comply with food safety requirements, must be "of the nature, substance and quality demanded", and must be correctly described (labelled). e036cc293c

In October 2024, the FDA created Human Foods Program, this is the new agency that transitioned from CFSAN. Many of the responsibilities from those offices were handled by CFSAN were incorporated into the new program, such as preventing food-borne illness, reviewing the safety of chemicals that are used in food, and supporting policies related to diet-related health concerns. This change was intended to modernize how the agency oversees the U.S. Food supply and improve coordination across food safety. e036cc293c The act was a consolidating act, bringing together existing powers into a single act without significant change. The regulation of food labels has evolved alongside the industrialization of food production and the growth of global mass food markets. In many countries, early food laws focused on preventing adulteration and fraud, often by mandating clear product names and ingredient listings. Over time, governments developed more detailed regulatory frameworks to manage food quality and public health through standardized labeling. Scholars have noted that as food systems scaled up and grew more impersonal, regulators across regions—from Europe and North America to East Asia—began using labels to simulate the trust once derived from local, interpersonal food markets. Labels became instruments of “informational governance,” conveying safety, nutritional value, and even moral or environmental claims.
