According to current research, the terms "psychological abuse" and "emotional abuse" are commonly used interchangeably, and as unassociated with physical abuse and accordingly physical violence, as opposed to "psychological violence". Usually, "emotional abuse" refers to any abuse that is emotional rather than physical, though experts often continue to find it difficult to recognize and operationally define it, and "experience uncertainty about proving it legally." 6bae00c586 Emotional abuse can take several forms. Three general... 6bae00c586 Abuse can occur in multiple ways, most commonly seen as physical, emotional, or sexual. Those in the disability population... 6bae00c586 Religious abuse can be perpetuated by religious leaders or other members of a religious community. It can happen in any religion or faith. Some examples of religious abuse include using religious teachings to justify abuse, enforcing strict religious rules and practices that are harmful, shaming or ostracizing individuals who do not conform to religious norms, using religious authority to manipulate or control others, and denying access to medical care or other basic needs in the name of

Disabled children are three times more likely to face violence than non-disabled children, and there is an approximate 50% increased risk of experiencing violence for adults with mental health conditions. 6bae00c586 == Psychological == 6bae00c586 == Physical abuse == 6bae00c586 == Risk factors for abuse == 6bae00c586 It is often associated with situations of controlling behavior in abusive relationships, and may include bullying, gaslighting, abuse in the workplace, amongst other behaviors that may cause an individual to feel unsafe. 6bae00c586 Elder abuse includes harms by people an older person knows or has a relationship with, such as a spouse, partner, or family member, a friend or neighbor, or people an older person relies on for services. Many forms of elder abuse are recognized as types of domestic violence or family violence since they are committed by family members. Paid caregivers have also been known to prey on elderly patients. 6bae00c586 Disabled people are easy targets for predators as they may not have the resources or abilities to escape an abusive situation or communicate about the occurrences. Hard of hearing persons are placed at twice the risk for neglect and emotional abuse in comparison to other disabilities and nearly four times in regards to physical abuse. 6bae00c586 Different jurisdictions have different requirements for mandatory reporting and have developed different definitions of what constitutes child abuse, and therefore have different criteria to remove children from their families or to prosecute a criminal charge. 6bae00c586 A power differential is not always easily identifiable, so an additionally important

characteristic of sibling abuse is that the incidents or patterns of behaviors between siblings pose a high risk of serious physical and/or emotional harm and may include sexual coercion or violence. Sibling sexual abuse includes sexual behaviors that are unwanted, pressured, coerced, and may include contact or non-contact behaviors. Physical, psychological, and sexual abuse can often co-occur. 6bae00c586

Abuse categories of child abuse: neglect, physical abuse, psychological/emotional abuse, and sexual abuse. Abuse can come in many forms, such as: physical or verbal maltreatment, injury, assault, violation, rape, unjust practices, crimes, or other types of aggression. Some sources describe abuse as "socially constructed", which means there may be more or less recognition of the suffering of a victim at different times and societies. Child sexual abuse is a form of child abuse in which Abuse is the act of improper usage or treatment of a person or thing, often to unfairly or improperly gain benefit 6bae00c586

More often than not, the younger sibling is abused by the older sibling. Sibling abuse often goes unrecognized, even by those harmed by it. Sibling abuse is the most common form of family violence in the US. Nationally-representative data collected in 2013 reported that about a third of US children, aged 0–17 years of age, had been victimized by their sibling. Sibling sexual abuse has been estimated to occur for between 1-7% of siblings. 6bae00c586 Abuse can be physical such as physically striking or sexually assaulting a patient or psychological. It also includes the intentional withholding of necessary food, physical care, and medical attention. 6bae00c586 Abuse amongst the general adult population has not been well-addressed in literature. 6bae00c586 As late as the 19th century, cruelty to children perpetrated by employers and teachers was commonplace and widespread, and corporal punishment was customary in many countries, but in the first half of the 19th century, pathologists studying filicide (the parental killing of children) reported cases of death from paternal rage, recurrent physical maltreatment, starvation, and sexual abuse. Disability abuse The abuse is not limited to those who are visibly disabled or physically deformed, but also includes those with learning, intellectual and developmental disabilities or mental illnesses. Those in the Disability abuse is when a person with a disability is abused physically, financially, sexually and/or psychologically due to the person being disabled. Abuse can occur in multiple ways, most commonly seen as physical, emotional, or sexual. This type of abuse has also been considered a hate crime. and nearly four times in regards to physical abuse 6bae00c586

Patient abuse and neglect may occur in settings such as hospitals, nursing homes, clinics and during home-based care. Health professionals who abuse patients may be deemed unfit to practice and have their medical license removed as well as facing criminal charges as well as civil cases. 6bae00c586

Elder abuse This definition has been adopted by the World Health Organization (WHO) from a definition put forward by Hourglass (formerly Action on Elder Abuse) in the UK. of physical abuse include signs of restraint such as rope marks on the wrist or broken eyeglasses. Emotional abuse often accompanies other types of abuse Elder abuse is the mistreatment, neglect, exploitation, or manipulation of old people. Laws protecting the elderly from abuse are similar to and related to laws protecting dependent adults from abuse 6bae00c586

Abuse of prisoners can include physical abuse, as well as psychological forms of harm including verbal abuse, sleep deprivation, white noise, pointless/absurd or humiliating instructions, recurrent exhaustive inspections and shakedowns, arbitrary strip searches, and denuding actions. 6bae00c586
