Zinc concentrations of zinc do not exceed: 1 µg/m³ in atmosphere, 300 mg/kg in soil, 100 mg/kg in vegetation, 20 µg/L in freshwater, and 5 µg/L in seawater Zinc is a chemical element; it has symbol Zn and atomic number 30. It is a slightly brittle metal at room temperature and has a shiny blue whitish appearance when surface oxidation is removed. The largest concentration of economically feasible lodes in descending order are located in China, Peru, and Australia, among others. In some respects, zinc is chemically similar to magnesium: both elements exhibit only one normal oxidation state (+2), and the Zn²⁺ and Mg²⁺ ions are of similar size. Zinc is refined industrially by froth flotation of the ore, roasting, and final extraction using electricity (electrowinning). Zinc is the 24th most abundant element in Earth's crust, with an average concentration of 70 grams per ton. The most common zinc ore is sphalerite (zinc blende), a zinc sulfide mineral. Zinc also has five stable isotopes; the most abundant of which, Zn-64, comprises nearly half of zinc's total abundance. It is the first element in group 12 (IIB) of the periodic table 1680bcfae3

The United Kingdom's Sea Fish Industry Authority, for example, classifies sardines as young pilchards. One criterion suggests fish shorter in length than 6 inches (15 cm) are sardines, and larger ones pilchards. The FAO/WHO Codex standard for canned sardines cites 12 species in the order of Clupeiformes that may be classed as sardines, including Atlantic herring (*Clupea harengus*), and brisling sardine (*Sprattus sprattus*); FishBase, a comprehensive database of information about fish, calls at least six species just 'pilchard', over a dozen just 'sardine', and many more with both those two basic names qualified by various adjectives.
