The widely used Bourdon gauge is a mechanical device, which both measures and indicates and is probably the best known type of gauge. Instruments used to measure and display pressure mechanically are called pressure gauges, vacuum gauges or compound gauges (vacuum & pressure). Cerebral circulation The neurovascular unit regulates cerebral blood flow so that activated neurons can be supplied with energy in the right amount and at the right time. Because the

brain would quickly suffer damage from any stoppage in blood supply, the cerebral circulatory system has safeguards including autoregulation of the blood vessels. The rate of cerebral blood flow in an adult human is typically 750 milliliters per minute, or about 15% of cardiac output. too little pressure could cause brain tissue to become ischemic (having inadequate blood flow), and too much could raise intracranial pressure. Arteries deliver oxygenated blood, glucose and other nutrients to the brain. Sudden intense accelerations change the gravitational forces perceived by bodies and can severely impair cerebral circulation and normal functions to the point of becoming serious life-threatening conditions. Arterial Cerebral circulation is the movement of blood through a network of cerebral arteries and veins supplying the brain. The failure of these safeguards may result in a stroke. The volume of blood in circulation is called the cerebral blood flow. Veins carry "used or spent" blood back to the heart, to remove carbon dioxide, lactic acid, and other metabolic products fd72b4c7cd

About 90–95% of cases are primary, defined as high blood pressure due to non-specific lifestyle and genetic factors. Lifestyle factors that increase the risk include excess salt in the diet, excess body weight, smoking, physical inactivity, and alcohol use. There are five types of blood vessels: the arteries, which carry the blood away from the heart; the arterioles; the capillaries, where the exchange of water and chemicals between the blood and tissues occurs; the venules; and the veins, which carry blood from the capillaries back towards the heart. fd72b4c7cd == Correlation-based approaches == fd72b4c7cd A vacuum gauge is used to measure pressures lower than the ambient atmospheric pressure, which is set as the zero point, in negative values (for instance, -1 bar or -760 mmHg equals total vacuum). Most gauges measure pressure relative to atmospheric pressure as the zero point, so this form of reading is simply referred to as "gauge pressure". However, anything greater than total vacuum is technically a form of pressure. Blood pressure The difference between the systolic and diastolic pressures is known as pulse pressure, while the average pressure during a cardiac cycle is known as mean arterial pressure. It is measured in millimetres of mercury (mmHg) above the surrounding atmospheric pressure, or in kilopascals (kPa). When used without qualification, the term "blood pressure" refers to the pressure in a brachial artery, where it is most commonly measured. Blood pressure (BP) is the pressure of circulating blood against the walls of blood vessels.
