The Thompson people use a decoction of wood and bark taken for nausea caused by smelling a corpse. 7b5bcae661 The shell is small, sturdy, and conical-ovate, reaching a maximum height of 4.8 mm (4.3 mm in holotype) and a width of 3.1 mm (2.8 mm in holotype). The protoconch is multispiral with a partially immersed nucleus. Protoconch I consists of about 0.8 whorls sculptured by 5-6 fine spiral lirae interspersed with microscopic granules. Protoconch II consists of about 1.2 whorls

sculptured by irregular pimples. The teleoconch consists of 3.8–4.6 convex whorls with strong cancellate sculpture formed by the intersection of equally developed spiral cords and axial ribs. Cords are narrow and well raised, numbering 13–15 on the body whorl. Axial ribs number 24–32 on the penultimate whorl. The last whorl is well-developed, comprising about three fourths of shell height, and may bear single or double varices. The aperture is wide and ovate. The outer lip is orthocline, internally smooth, and externally markedly thickened by a strong rim covered by spiral cords.

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Scotch bonnet (sea snail) giving it a toothed appearance. The common name "Scotch bonnet" alludes to the general outline and color pattern of the shell, which vaguely resemble a tam o' shanter, a traditional Scottish bonnet or cap. The surface sculpture of the shell is highly variable: the surface can be smooth and polished, have grooves, be granulated, or even be nodulose on the shoulder of the whorls. The shell is egg-

shaped and fairly large, 2 to 4 inches (5 to 10 cm) in maximum dimension, with a regular pattern of yellow, orange or brown squarish spots. The lower part of the inner lip near the siphonal notch has many "pimple-like" bumps or pustules. Eagle warrior The word *cuāuhcēlōtl* derives from

the eagle warrior *cuāuhtli* and the jaguar warrior *ocēlōtl* [o'se:lo:tɬ]. These military orders were made up of the bravest soldiers of noble birth and those who had taken the greatest number of prisoners in battle. They were a type of Aztec warrior called a *cuāuhocēlōtl* [kʷa:wo'se:lo:tɬ]. They emerged from the fire transforming Eagle warriors or eagle knights (Classical Nahuatl: *cuāuhtli* ['kʷa:mtɬi] (singular) or *cuāuhmeh* ['kʷa:ɬmeʔ] (plural)) were a special class of infantry soldier in the Aztec army, one of the two leading military special forces orders in Aztec society, the other being the Jaguar warriors. *Nanahuatzin*, meaning Pimply One, and *Tecuciztecatl*, meaning Lord of Snails, who sacrificed themselves to bring life to the sun. Of all of the Aztec warriors, they were the most feared. Eagle warriors, along with the jaguar warriors, were the only such classes that did not restrict access solely to the nobility, as commoners or, in Nahuatl, "*mācēhualli*" (Nahuatl pronunciation: [ma:se:wali]) were occasionally admitted for special merit 7b5bcae661

Tricho-dento-osseous syndrome (TDO) is a rare, systemic, autosomal dominant genetic disorder that causes defects in hair, teeth, and bones respectively. The hair defects are characterized as being rough, course, with profuse shedding. The cause of this disease is a mutation in the DLX3 (distal-less 3) gene, which controls hair follicle differentiation and induction of bone formation. This disease is present at birth. Hair is curly and kinky at infancy but later straightens. Dental defects are characterized by dark-yellow/brownish colored teeth, thin and/or possibly pitted enamel, that is malformed. All patients with TDO have two co-existing conditions called enamel hypoplasia and taurodontism in which the abnormal growth patterns of the teeth result in severe external and internal defects. TDO has been shown to occur in areas of close geographic proximity and within families; most recent documented cases are in Virginia, Tennessee, and North Carolina

Before puberty, the external sex organs, known as primary sexual characteristics, are sex characteristics that distinguish males and females. In response to the signals, the gonads produce hormones that stimulate libido and the growth, function, and transformation of the brain, bones, muscle, blood, skin, hair, breasts, and sex organs. Physical growth—height and weight—accelerates in the first half of puberty and is completed when an adult body has been developed. Puberty leads to sexual dimorphism
