

Craving Meaning In Tamil

The Vedic word *támas* refers to "darkness", and stems from the Indo-European word **temH-es*, meaning "dark". Cognates with the Vedic include the Lithuanian word *tamsà* meaning "darkness", the Serbian word *tama* meaning "darkness", as well as the Latin word *tenebrae* meaning "darkness", the latter whence English *tenebrous*.

Deva (Hinduism) Asura in Hindu mythology, born of the same father. Deva is a masculine term; the feminine equivalent is Devi. The word is a cognate with Latin *deus* ('god') and Greek *Zeus*. Tamas (philosophy) 'darkness') is one of the three *guṇas* (tendencies, qualities, attributes), a philosophical and psychological concept developed by the Samkhya school of Hindu philosophy. == Plot == Spiritually Elevating songs == Thayumanavar was a respected scholar in Tamil. He was also a scholar in Sanskrit and was a minister to the King in Tiruchirapalli in South India. His name hails from the name of the deity of the Thayumanaswami Temple... The author and the century in which Annapurna Upanishad was composed is unknown. Manuscripts of this text are also found titled as Annapurnopanisad. This Upanishad is listed at number 70 in the Telugu language... Historical Indian scholars recognized and debated the inherent tension between active pursuit of wealth (Artha) and pleasure (Kama), and renunciation of all wealth and pleasure for the sake of spiritual liberation (Moksha). They proposed "action with renunciation" or "craving-free, dharma-driven action", also called Nishkama Karma as a possible solution to the tension.

Kural The traditional accounts describe it as the last work of the third Sangam, but linguistic analysis suggests a later date of 450 to 500 CE and that it was composed after the Sangam period. Etymologically The Tirukkural (Tamil: திருக்குறள், lit. 'sacred verses'), or shortly the Kural (Tamil: குறள்), is a classic Tamil language text on commoner's morality consisting of 1,330 short couplets, or kurals, of seven words each. The text has been dated variously from 300 BCE to 5th century CE. The text is divided into three books with aphoristic teachings on virtue (aram), wealth (porul) and love (inbam), respectively. Its authorship is traditionally attributed to Valluvar, also known in full as Thiruvalluvar. The term tiru has as many as 19 different meanings in Tamil. honorable, and beautiful. It is widely acknowledged for its universality and secular nature. Kural means something that is short, concise, and abridged

Thayumanavar articulated Thayumanavar or Tayumanavar (Tamil: தையுமானவர் Tāyumānavar) (1705–1744) was a Tamil spiritual philosopher from Tamil Nadu, India. Thayumanavar articulated the Saiva Siddhanta philosophy. He wrote several Tamil hymns of which 1454 are available. His first four songs were sung 250 years ago at the Congress of Religions in Tiruchirappalli.
