Rabies Rabies causes about 59,000 human deaths Rabies is a viral disease that causes inflammation of the brain in humans and other mammals. of 2016[update], only fourteen people were documented to have survived a rabies infection after showing symptoms. Once symptoms appear, the result is virtually always death. The time depends on the distance the virus must travel along peripheral nerves to reach the central nervous system. The time period between contracting the infection and the start of symptoms is usually one to three months but can vary from less than one week to more than one year. Early symptoms can include fever and abnormal sensations at the site of exposure, which are followed by nausea, vomiting, violent movements, uncontrolled excitement, fear of water, inability to move parts of the body, confusion, and loss of consciousness 31a9348879

Furthermore, there are many relationships that must be considered when discussing wildlife disease, which are represented through the Epidemiological Triad Model. This model describes the relationship between a pathogen, host and the environment. There are many routes to infection of a susceptible host by a pathogen, but when the host becomes infected that host now has the potential to infect other hosts.
