It shares official status with Spanish in three autonomous communities in eastern Spain – Catalonia; the Balearic Islands; and the Valencian Community, where it is called Valencian (valencià) – and is the sole official language of Andorra. The term Afro-Latin American is not widely used in Latin America outside academic circles. Afro-Latinos are part of the wider African diaspora. == Family and youth == Distribution == In contrast with his predecessors, President Fox chose the members of his cabinet through head hunters.
