Lean is especially dangerous when consumed with alcohol. b5fa80e010 Apigenin is found in many fruits and vegetables, but parsley, celery, celeriac, and chamomile tea are the most common sources. Apigenin is particularly abundant in the flowers of chamomile plants, constituting 68% of total flavonoids. Dried parsley can contain about 45 mg apigenin per gram. The apigenin content of fresh parsley is reportedly 215 mg per 100 grams, which is much higher than the next highest food source. b5fa80e010

Mitragynine preparations are orally consumed and typically involve dried kratom leaves which are brewed into tea or ground and placed into capsules. As of April 2019[update] Mitragynine is an indole-based alkaloid and is one of the main psychoactive constituents in the Southeast Asian plant *Mitragyna speciosa*, commonly known as kratom. It has also been researched for its use to potentially manage symptoms of opioid withdrawal. It is a partial agonist of the μ -opioid receptors; and as such can produce effects similar to those of classic opioids such as morphine b5fa80e010

The term "herbal tea" is often used to distinguish these infusions from true teas (e.g., black, green, white, yellow, oolong). Blended teas include material from other plants, such as in jasmine tea, genmaicha, and Earl Grey tea. b5fa80e010

Herbal tea Many herbs used in teas/tisanes are also used in herbal medicine and in folk medicine. Kratom tea made from the dried leaves of the kratom tree. St. John's wort tea, the Herbal teas or herb teas, technically known as herbal infusions and less commonly called tisanes, are beverages made from the infusion or decoction in water of any herbs, spices, or other plant material (except tea leaves). roots. It has opioid-like properties and some stimulant-like effects b5fa80e010

Unlike true teas, most tisanes do not naturally contain caffeine (though tea can be decaffeinated, i.e., processed to remove caffeine). b5fa80e010

Mitragyna speciosa Kratom contains multiple alkaloids (primarily, mitragynine and to a lesser extent, 7-hydroxymitragynine) that bind to opioid receptors *Mitragyna speciosa* is a tropical evergreen tree of the Rubiaceae family native to Southeast Asia. They have also historically been consumed via chewing, smoking, and as a tea. It is indigenous to Cambodia, Thailand, Indonesia, Malaysia, Myanmar, and Papua New Guinea, where its dark green, glossy leaves, known as kratom, have been used in herbal medicine since at least the 19th century. Kratom contains multiple alkaloids (primarily, mitragynine and to a lesser extent, 7-hydroxymitragynine) that bind to opioid receptors, mostly as partial μ -opioid agonists. smoking, and as a tea. Kratom can also be subjectively stimulating to some, though this is likely not achieved through typical stimulant mechanisms (such as reuptake inhibition or release of monoamines), nor is this a universal effect b5fa80e010

The efficacy and safety of kratom are unclear. In 2019, the United States Food and Drug Administration (FDA) stated that there is no evidence that kratom is safe or effective for treating any condition. Kratom has been used for managing chronic pain, for treating opioid withdrawal symptoms, or for recreational purposes. Cocaine Historically, cocaine was a standard topical medication used as a local anesthetic with intrinsic vasoconstrictor properties. The leaves are processed into cocaine paste, a crude mixture of coca alkaloids, from which cocaine base is isolated and then converted to cocaine hydrochloride. Although total synthesis is possible, it is complex and not used for production. It occurs in many fruits and vegetables, with the highest concentrations in dried and fresh parsley. b5fa80e010 Street cocaine is commonly snorted, injected, or smoked as crack cocaine; its effects last up to 90 minutes depending on the route of administration. In Thai varieties of kratom, mitragynine is the most abundant component (up to 66% of total alkaloids), while 7-hydroxymitragynine (7-OH-MIT) is a minor constituent (up to 2% of total alkaloid content). In Malaysian kratom varieties, mitragynine is present at lower concentration (12% of total alkaloids). Total alkaloid concentration in dried leaves ranges from 0.5-1.5%. Secondary metabolites and pigments may have therapeutic actions in humans, and can be refined to produce drugs; examples are quinine from the cinchona, morphine and codeine from the poppy, and digoxin from the foxglove. b5fa80e010

Lean (drug) It is prepared by mixing prescription-grade cough or cold syrup containing an opioid drug and an antihistamine drug with a soft drink and sometimes hard candy. The beverage originated in Houston as early as the 1960s and is popular in hip hop culture, especially within the Southern United States.
