

Medical Tape For Dressing

Tape is long, narrow, thin strip of material usually used to stick things together. (see also Ribbon (disambiguation): 3e5fc31f06 The active (wound-side) surface of the dressing is coated with a cross-linked dispersion of gelatin, pectin, and carboxymethyl cellulose together with other polymers, elastomers, and/or adhesives to form a flexible, thin wafer or film; the outer side is typically a polyurethane tape or foam. In contact with wound exudate, the polysaccharides and other polymers absorb water and swell, forming a gel. The location of the wound determines the type used. Bandages can often be improvised as the situation demands, using clothing, blankets or other material. Wound closure strip They are applied across the laceration in a manner which pulls the skin on either side of the wound together. 2-cyanoacrylate is available as Epiglu. Wound closure strips may be used instead of sutures (stitches) in some injuries, because they lessen scarring and are easier to care for. Standard doctrine is that a casualty's dressing should be used rather than the rescuer's – the rescuer may need to help another casualty, or be helped himself, whereas the original casualty is not going to make any other use of his own dressing. Because of this, it is important that soldiers know where to find their comrades' field dressings, and infantry units typically have their own SOP stating where they should be carried. British Army uniforms issued in the past included dedicated field dressing pockets. During the Great War, this pocket was in the front left skirt of the tunic, with the introduction of Battledress (1937), it was moved to the trousers, but the current clothing does not. Bandage When used with a dressing, the dressing is applied directly on a wound, and a bandage is used to hold the dressing in place. Other bandages are used without dressings, such as elastic bandages, which are used to reduce swellings or to provide support to a sprained joint. Tight bandages can be used to slow blood flow to an extremity, such as when a leg or arm is bleeding heavily. Surgical tape Surgical tape is often white because it contains zinc oxide, which is added to help prevent infections. They allow air to reach the skin ("breathable"). These tapes usually have a hypoallergenic adhesive which is designed to hold firmly onto skin, dressing materials, and underlying layers of tape, but to remove easily without damaging the skin. Some breathable tapes such as kinesiology tape, and other elastic bandages with adhesive are made of cotton. Tapes made of porous material, such as 3M Micropore, are widely used. It consists of a large pad of absorbent cloth, attached to the middle of a strip of thin fabric used to bind the pad in place.
