It is sometimes also called birch sugar as it can be extracted from birch wood. It should not be confused with birch syrup, which is made from birch sap and contains only trace amounts of xylitol. The name derives from Ancient Greek: ξύλον, xyl[on] 'wood', with the suffix -itol used to denote it being a sugar alcohol. In 2006, Smint and Chupa Chups were taken over by Perfetti Van Melle. In 2009, Smint launched Smint-XXL tins in the UK, which are three times larger than regular Smint dispensers. In 1975 Jenkki introduced the first chewing gum in the world that included xylitol. Xylitol gum was invented in Turku, Finland. The xylitol was originally derived from birch trees. Nowadays Jenkki xylitol gum is available in numerous different flavours, including peppermint, spearmint, eucalyptus, lemon, tutti frutti, strawberry and salmiakki. In modern chewing gum, if natural rubber such as chicle is used, it must pass several purity and cleanliness tests. However, most modern types of chewing gum use synthetic gum-based materials and chemicals such as sugar and artificial flavoring chemicals. These materials allow for longer lasting flavor, a softer texture, and a reduction in tackiness. Polyol and Xylitol are two carbohydrate sugars that are used in the production of bubble gum and chewing gum. Rubbers are one additive that are in both bubble gum and chewing gum; however, the components of the rubber in the bubble gum are larger in mass than in chewing gum. == History == Smint was first conceived by Chupa Chups in 1990 as a sugar-free product targeted at adult consumers. After four years of development, Smint was introduced to the market as a subsidiary brand, and launched in the UK a year later in 1995. In 1996 Smint started their "No Smint, no kiss" campaign, aiming to make the brand name "smint" synonymous with "kissing breath".
