Kerala It was formed on 1 November 1956 under the States Reorganisation Act, which unified the country's Malayalam-speaking regions into a single state. Kerala, officially Keralam (Malayalam: [ˈkeːrɐɭɐm] Kēraḷam), is a state on the Malabar Coast of southern India. Covering 38,863 km² (15,005 sq mi), Kerala is primarily a strip of coastal plains sandwiched by the Western Ghats and the Laccadive Sea, bound by Karnataka to the northeast, Tamil Nadu to the east, and the Lakshadweep islands in the western vicinity. It was formed on 1 November 1956 under Kerala, officially Keralam (Malayalam: [ˈkeːrɐɭɐm] Kēraḷam), is a state on the Malabar Coast of southern India. Thiruvananthapuram is the capital city while the Kochi metropolitan area is the state's most populated region. Malayalam is the most widely spoken language and, alongside English, serves as an official language of the state. With 33 million inhabitants according to the 2011 census, Kerala is the 13th-most populous state in India

In the 8th century, Adi Shankara was born in Kalady in central Kerala. He travelled extensively across the Indian subcontinent founding institutions of the widely influential philosophy of Advaita Vedanta. The Cheras regained control over Kerala in the 9th

century until the kingdom was dissolved in the 12th century, after which small autonomous chiefdoms, most notably the Kingdom of Kozhikode, arose. The ports of Kozhikode and Kochi acted as major gateways to the western coast of medieval South India... dc14ac1acc

History of Kerala The Cheras transformed Kerala into an international trade centre by establishing trade relations across the Arabian Sea with all major Mediterranean and Red Sea ports as well those of Eastern Africa and the Far East. It was mentioned as one of four independent kingdoms in southern India during Ashoka's rule, the others being the Cholas, Pandyas and Satyaputras. The dominion of Cheras was located in one of the key routes of the ancient Indian Ocean trade. The early Cheras collapsed after repeated attacks from the neighboring Cholas and Rashtrakutas. The Cheras transformed Kerala into an international Kerala was first epigraphically recorded as Cheras (Keralaputra) in a 3rd-century BCE rock inscription by the Mauryan emperor Ashoka of Magadha. kingdoms in southern India during Ashoka's rule, the others being the Cholas, Pandyas and Satyaputras dc14ac1acc

The Vijayanagara Empire rose in response to the Islamic intervention and covered most of southern India. It acted as a bulwark against the Deccan Sultanate and Mughal expansion into the south. When the European powers arrived during the 16th and 18th centuries CE, the southern kingdoms, most notably Tipu Sultan's Kingdom of Mysore, resisted the new threats, but many parts eventually succumbed to British conquest.
