Differences in skin color among individuals is caused by variation in pigmentation, which is largely due to genetics (inherited from one's biological parents), and, in adults in particular, to exposure to the sun, disorders, or some combination thereof. The mushroom was first classified as *Agaricus confluens* by Christian Hendrik Persoon in 1796. In 1828, Persoon re-classified this species under the name of *Agaricus archyropus*. In 1828, Elias Magnus Fries gave the mushroom the name *Maramius archyropus* and so put it in the genus *Marasmius*. Indeed, he used also the younger epithet *archyropus*, although the older epithet *confluens* through the designation took precedence. This was corrected in 1898 by P. Skin care includes modifications of individual behavior and of environmental and working conditions. Skin care is applied during recovery from wound healing, radiation therapy, and the management of some medications. 3e19e451d3 Efforts to lighten the skin date back to at least the 16th century in Asia. While a number of agents — such as kojic acid and alpha hydroxy acid — are allowed in cosmetics in Europe, a number of others such as hydroquinone and tretinoin are not. Cosmetics have various purposes, including personal and skin care, or to treat uneven skin tone. They are mixtures of chemical compounds derived from either natural sources or created synthetically. They should be avoided by people with dry or sensitive skin because these cosmetics are substances that are intended for application to the body for cleansing, beautifying, promoting attractiveness, or altering appearance. Makeup can add color to the face, enhance features, or alter appearance to resemble a different person, creature, or object. They are left on to dry and then gently peeled off.

== Use == Human skin color is influenced greatly by the amount of the pigment melanin present. Melanin is produced within the skin in cells called melanocytes; it is the main determinant of the skin color of darker-skin humans. The skin color of people with light skin is determined mainly by the bluish-white connective tissue under the dermis and by the hemoglobin circulating in the veins of the dermis. The red color underlying the skin becomes more visible, especially in the face, when, as a consequence of physical exercise, sexual arousal, or the stimulation of the nervous system (e.g. due to anger or embarrassment...). Some early cosmetics contained harmful ingredients, such as lead, which caused serious health problems and sometimes resulted in death. Modern commercial cosmetics are generally tested for safety but may contain controversial ingredients, such as per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS), formaldehyde releasers, and ingredients that cause allergic reactions.

Collybiopsis confluens In some instances, they can be unevenly battered or branched like coral. Skin care needs vary according to age, diseases, wounds, exposure to the sun, environmental extremes, and chemicals. Skin care products exist as regulated prescription drugs and as topical agents marketed as cosmetics but having no clinical proof of efficacy. A skin care physician is called a dermatologist. For a long time, the species was labelled as *Collybia confluens*, following Paul Kummer. This name is still in use today... The use of cosmetics to enhance complexion reaches back into antiquity. "Face painting" is mentioned in the Old Testament (Ezekiel 23:40). Ancient Egyptians used foundation. In 200 BC, ancient Greek women applied white lead powder and chalk to lighten their skin. It was considered fashionable for Greek women to have a pale complexion. Roman women also favoured a pale complexion. Wealthy Romans favoured white lead paste, which could lead to disfigurement and death. Men also wore makeup to lighten their skin tone, using white lead powder, chalk, and creams. The cream was made from animal fat, starch, and tin oxide. The fat was rendered from animal carcasses and heated to remove the color. Tin oxide was made out of heating tin metal in the open air. The animal fat provided a smooth texture, while the tin oxide provided color to the cream. The European Union and regulatory agencies around the world have stringent regulations for cosmetics...
