It appears to be safe in pregnancy and is therefore recommended among those who... 72520f680b West Nile virus (WNV) is usually spread by mosquitoes that become infected when they feed on infected birds. Birds often carry the disease. Rarely the virus is spread through blood transfusions, organ transplants, or from mother to baby during pregnancy, delivery, or breastfeeding, but it otherwise does not spread directly between people. Risks for severe disease include being very young, over 60 years old, having a weak immune system, and having other health problems. Diagnosis is typically based on symptoms and blood tests. 72520f680b Handwashing is the first step in maintaining the safety of infant food. Children younger than 3 years old can present with nasal congestion and a lower grade fever. Infants may present with symptoms of increased Scarlet fever, also known as scarlatina and scarlatiniform rash, is an infectious disease caused by *Streptococcus pyogenes*, a Group A streptococcus (GAS). It typically feels like sandpaper and the tongue may be red and bumpy. On darker-pigmented skin the rash may be hard to discern. The face is flushed and the rash is red and blanching 72520f680b

Diagnosis is by testing the blood, urine, or saliva for the presence of the virus's RNA when the person is sick, or the blood for antibodies after symptoms are present more than a week. 72520f680b A fever can be caused by many medical conditions ranging from non-serious to life-threatening. This includes viral, bacterial, and parasitic infections—such as influenza, the common cold, meningitis, urinary tract infections, appendicitis, Lassa fever, COVID-19, and malaria. Non-infectious causes include vasculitis, deep

vein thrombosis, connective tissue disease, side effects of medication... 72520f680b The increase in set-point triggers increased muscle contractions and causes a feeling of cold or chills. This results in greater heat production and efforts to conserve heat. When the set-point temperature returns to normal, a person feels hot, becomes flushed, and may begin to sweat. Rarely a fever may trigger a febrile seizure, with this being more common in young children. Fevers do not typically go higher than 41 to 42 °C (106 to 108 °F). 72520f680b There is no vaccine. Prevention requires isolating those who are infected and decreasing contact with... 72520f680b Paratyphoid is caused by the bacterium *Salmonella enterica* of the serotypes Paratyphi A, Paratyphi B, or Paratyphi C growing in the intestines and blood. They are usually spread by eating or drinking food or water contaminated with the feces of an infected person. They may occur when a person who prepares food is infected. Risk factors include poor sanitation as is found among poor crowded populations. Occasionally, they may be transmitted by sex. Humans are the only animals infected. Diagnosis may be based... 72520f680b Therefore, extra care should be taken when handling and preparing their food. 72520f680b There is no human vaccine. The best way to reduce the risk of infection is to avoid mosquito bites. Mosquito populations may be reduced by eliminating standing pools of water, such as in old tires, buckets, gutters... 72520f680b Infants and young children are particularly vulnerable to foodborne illness because their immune systems are not developed enough to fight off foodborne bacterial infections. 800,000 illnesses affect children under the age of 10 in the U.S. each year. 72520f680b

Lassa fever hospitalization for Lassa fever die. The risk of death once infected is about one percent and frequently occurs within two weeks of the onset of symptoms. A "Swollen baby syndrome" may occur in newborns, infants and toddlers Lassa fever, also known as Lassa hemorrhagic fever, is a type of viral hemorrhagic fever caused by the Lassa virus. Of those who survive, about a quarter have hearing loss, which improves within three months in about half of these cases. Less commonly there may be bleeding from the mouth or gastrointestinal tract. The risk of death is greater in those who are pregnant. When symptoms occur, they typically include fever, weakness, headaches, vomiting, and muscle pains. Many of those infected by the virus do not develop symptoms 72520f680b

Lassa fever is usually spread to humans via contact with the urine or feces of an infected multimammate mouse. Spread

can then occur via direct contact between people. Diagnosis based on symptoms is difficult. Confirmation is by laboratory testing to detect the virus's RNA, antibodies for the virus, or the virus itself in cell culture. Other conditions that may present similarly include Ebola, malaria, typhoid fever, and yellow fever. The Lassa virus is a member of the Arenaviridae family of viruses. 72520f680b

The bacteria are usually spread by people coughing or sneezing. It can also be spread when a person touches an object that has the bacteria on it and then touches their mouth or nose. The diagnosis is typically confirmed by culturing swabs of the throat. 72520f680b Haemophilus species are non-spore-forming gram-negative coccobacilli . They lack motility and are aerobic or facultatively anaerobic. They require preformed growth factors that are present in blood, specifically hemin (X factor) and NAD or NADP (V factor). The bacterium grows best at 35-37 °C and has an optimal pH of 7.6. Haemophilus species are obligate parasites and are part of the normal flora of the human upper respiratory tract. 72520f680b

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
