The APDH played an important role in the defense of human rights during the military dictatorship. Later it supported the work of CONADEP fights... The agency was used by the mexican government to spy political opposition and commit human rights violations during what is called the Mexican Dirty War. It was dissolved in 1985 following the uncovering of its involvement in the torture and murder of Enrique "Kiki" Camarena, succeeded by the General Directorate of Investigation and National Security (Dirección General de Investigación y Seguridad Nacional), which later was renamed as the National Security and Investigation Centre (Centro de Investigación y Seguridad Nacional, CISEN) in 1989. In 2018 it became the National Intelligence Centre (Centro Nacional de Inteligencia, CNI).

Támara prison riot Spanish: Centro Femenino de Adaptación Social (CEFAS) "46 Killed On 20 June 2023, a prison riot broke out in the Women's Center for Social Adaptation, a women's prison located in Támara, Honduras, about 29 km (18 mi) northwest from Tegucigalpa, the nation's capital. preocupaciones sobre la seguridad y los derechos humanos de todos los privados de libertad"). The precise circumstances surrounding the incident are currently being investigated. The riot is suspected to be the result of a conflict between female members of the MS-13 and 18th Street gangs. Forty-six people were killed, with most from a fire that began amid the chaos

The Brotherhood of the Marshes was founded on 4 May 1296 by Cantabrian and Basque coastal towns such as Santander, Laredo, Castro-Urdiales, Bermeo, Guetaria, San Sebastián, Fuenterrabía and Vitoria (later joined by San Vicente de la Barquera in 1297). It was formed to defend their common interests against the Crown, preserve the privileges they had gained during the Reconquista and regulate trade with France, England and Flanders, avoiding internal and external conflicts. The Committee of Stockholm awarded her the International Prize of Criminology (equivalent to the Nobel Prize in Criminology).

At the time, the prison housed between 800 and 900 inmates, double its rated capacity. The prison has been an ongoing scene of cross-gang conflict, particularly between the 18th Street gang and MS-13, deadly archrivals.
