Software developer Graydon Hoare created Rust in 2006 while working at Mozilla, which officially sponsored the project in 2009. The first stable release, Rust 1.0, was published in May 2015. The project has been sponsored by the Rust Foundation since February 2021. Despite its common association with corrosion, the term "Salt Belt" should not be confused with "Rust Belt," which is a similar region in the United States that has been affected by industrial... The usage has expanded to other climatic, economic, and cultural concentrations. These regions are not formally defined; they frequently overlap and have vague borders. The terminology is also used outside the U.S. (e.g. India's Hindi Belt). The Rust Belt experienced industrial decline beginning in the 1950s and 1960s, with manufacturing peaking as a percentage of U.S. GDP... Given sufficient time, any iron mass in the presence of water and oxygen will form rust and could eventually convert entirely to rust. Surface rust is commonly flaky and friable, and provides no passivational protection to the underlying iron unlike other metals such as aluminum, copper, and tin which form stable oxide layers. Rusting is the common term for corrosion of elemental iron and its alloys such as steel. Many other metals undergo

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similar corrosion, but the resulting oxides are not commonly called "rust". Road salt is a common cause for corrosion of automobile parts, and vehicles in the Salt Belt often experience more rapid rusting compared to other regions of the country, often requiring more frequent maintenance as brake lines, electrical wiring, and structural components are adversely affected. Manufacturer recalls for corrosion issues often target only vehicles operated within Salt Belt states.
