People who abstain from eating meat are generally known as vegetarians and people who avoid all animal by-products are known as vegans. The majority of the world’s health and dietetics associations state that a well-planned vegetarian or vegan diet can be nutritionally adequate for all stages of life. Adults can weigh from 1.5 to 3.0 lb (0.68 to 1.36 kg), males are typically heavier than females. Body length is normally from 14 to 17 in (36 to 43 cm), with a 3-to-4-inch (7.6 to 10.2 cm) tail. Through brain stimulation and pharmacological challenges, such emotional responses can be effectively monitored. Cognitive bias tests and learned helplessness models have shown feelings of optimism and pessimism in a wide range of species, including rats, dogs, cats, rhesus macaques, sheep, chicks, starlings, pigs, and honeybees. Charles Darwin was one of the first scientists to write about the subject, and his observational (and sometimes anecdotal) approach has since developed into a more robust, hypothesis-driven, scientific approach. The existence and nature of emotions in non-human animals are believed to be correlated with those of humans and to have evolved from the same mechanisms. But does this mean an animal feels—is aware of—pain as we are, or does it merely mean it is programmed Emotion is defined as any mental experience with high intensity and high hedonic content. Jaak Panksepp played a large role in the study of animal emotion, basing his research on the neurological aspect 9efbfc79e5

== History == 9efbfc79e5 Much like regular folklore, weather lore is passed down through speech and writing from normal people without the use of external measuring instruments. The origin of weather lore can be dated back to primeval people and their usage of star studying in navigation. However, more recently during the Late Middle Ages, the works of two Greek philosopher-poets, Theophrastus of Eresus on Lesbos and Aratus of Macedonia, are known for shaping the prediction of weather. Theophrastus and Aratus collated their works in two main collections for weather lore: On Weather Signs and On Winds. These were used for helping farmers with harvest, merchants for trade and determining the weather the next day. 9efbfc79e5

Unlike some other prairie dogs, these animals do not truly hibernate. A black-tailed prairie dog town in Texas was reported to cover 25,000 mi² (64,000 km²) and included 400,000,000 individuals. nitrogen concentrations than plants in mixed-grass prairie outside colonies. Prior to habitat destruction, the species may have been the most abundant prairie dog in central North America. The black-tailed prairie dog can be seen above ground in midwinter.
