They arrived around the 7th century AD, and were under the domination of the Chichimecas. After Aztec domination, its name was changed to 'Malacatepec', meaning "spindle hill". After the arrival of the Spaniards, the town fought with the Aztecs but the area was subdued by Gonzalo de Sandoval in 1521. The Moncaleanos ran the Casa del obrero (Worker's House) in Bogota, Colombia. After her husband's arrest in 1911, Moncaleano fled with him to Cuba to escape political persecution. They taught at anarchist schools and raised their children there before the Mexican Revolution motivated them to join the fight to reconstruct Mexican society. While in Mexico the Moncaleanos supported the Mexican Liberal Party (PLM - Partido Liberal Mexicano) and the anarchists Flores Magon. She published in the newspaper Tierra, a leftist weekly publication. List of neighborhoods in Mexico City When writing a postal address the name of the colonia must be specified after the postal code and preceding the name of the city. Unlike neighborhoods in the United States, colonias in Mexico City have a specific name which is used in all official documents and postal addresses. One theory suggests that the name, which literally means colony, arose in the late 19th and early 20th centuries, when one of the first urban developments outside Mexico City's core was built by a French immigrant colony. Usually, colonias are assigned a specific postal code; nonetheless, in recent urban developments, gated communities are also defined as colonias, yet they share the postal code with adjacent neighborhoods.
