Curly Girl Method Among other things, it calls for the use of a cleansing conditioner in place of shampoo (also called "conditioner washing" or "co-washing") The Curly Girl Method is an approach to hair care designed by author Lorraine Massey for textured hair in its natural state (coils, waves, and curls) that has not been chemically relaxed. The goal is to treat naturally curly hair gently, minimizing damage to the hair cuticle; to keep it moisturized, since curly hair. This method discourages the daily use of sulfate shampoo, which is considered too harsh for curly hair. It also includes tips for using hair gel and other styling products. However, some curly hair care routines include the occasional use of sulfate shampoos to remove heavy buildup from styling products, excess oils, or silicones that sulfate-free shampoos may not fully cleanse.
