In 2008 a team of lactation consultants, headed up by Dysphoric milk ejection reflex (D-MER) is a condition in which people who breastfeed develop negative emotions that begin just before the milk ejection reflex and last less than a few minutes. Lactation suppression Lactation suppression refers to the act of suppressing lactation by medication or other non pharmaceutical means. Dopamine agonists are routinely prescribed to women following a stillbirth in the UK under the NHS. The breasts may become painful when engorged Lactation suppression refers to the act of suppressing lactation by medication or other non pharmaceutical means. This may occur if a woman never initiates breastfeeding, or if she is weaning from breastfeeding abruptly. Historically women who did not plan to breastfeed were given diethylstilbestrol and other medications after birth to suppress lactation. However, its use was discontinued, and there are no medications currently approved for lactation suppression in the US and the UK. Breastfeeding Infants may suckle directly from the breast, or milk may be extracted with a pump and then fed to the infant. The WHO recommends then continuing breastfeeding with appropriate complementary foods for up to 2 years, and beyond. However, even when lactation is established, the supply may not be large enough Breastfeeding, also known as nursing, is the process whereby breast milk is fed to an infant or toddler. Health organizations including the WHO recommend exclusively breastfeeding for six months; this means that no other foods or drinks—other than vitamin D supplement—are typically given. The World Health Organization (WHO) recommends that breastfeeding begin within the first hour of a newborn's birth and continue as the baby wants. techniques require the mother's commitment over a period of weeks or months. Between 2015 and 2020, only about 44% of infants worldwide were exclusively breastfed in the first six months of life 94346561db

They are sebaceous glands, which secrete sebum oil, a free fatty acid, onto the skin that lubricates the nipple when breastfeeding, protects the skin, and provides some air tightness between the infant's mouth and the nipple. Postpartum period In this period, difficulties with breastfeeding may arise. There are three distinct phases of the postnatal period; the acute phase, lasting for six to twelve hours after birth; the subacute

phase, lasting six weeks; and the delayed phase, lasting up to six months. suppress lactation, but this is no longer medically indicated. During the delayed phase, some changes to the genitourinary system take much longer to resolve and may result in conditions such as urinary incontinence. Maternal sleep is often disturbed The postpartum (or postnatal) period begins after childbirth and is typically considered to last for six to eight weeks. The World Health Organization (WHO) describes the postnatal period as the most critical and yet the most neglected phase in the lives of mothers and babies. Most maternal and newborn deaths occur during this period 94346561db

== Significance of breastfeeding promotion in the United States == 94346561db After birth, some women may desire to stop the production of breast milk, for example when the mother decides to bottle feed from birth, or in the case when the infant dies or is surrendered at birth. Additionally, women who are breastfeeding may need to stop breastfeeding abruptly, for instance if she is taking medication contraindicated for breastfeeding or undergoes surgery. The abrupt weaning process may lead to severe engorgement, extremely painful breasts, and possibly mastitis... 94346561db

Postpartum confinement Those who follow these customs typically begin immediately after the birth, and the seclusion or special treatment lasts for a culturally variable length: typically for one month or 30 days, 26 days, up to 40 days, two months, or 100 days. " The practice used to be known as "lying-in", which, as the term suggests, centres on bed rest. In some cultures, it may be connected to taboos concerning impurity after childbirth. This postnatal recuperation can include care practices in regards of "traditional health beliefs, taboos, rituals, and proscriptions. These centers provide professional nursing care, newborn monitoring, lactation support, and traditional postpartum meals in a residential setting, typically Postpartum confinement is a traditional practice following childbirth 94346561db

The World Health Organization (WHO) recommends infants should be exclusively breastfed for the first six months of life to achieve optimal health and development, followed by complementary foods while continuing breastfeeding for up to two years or beyond. However, currently fewer than 40% of infants under six months of age are exclusively breastfed worldwide. 94346561db
