

When Titanic Was Made

Titanic It was the second time White Star Line had lost a ship on her maiden voyage, the first being RMS Tayleur in 1854. Of the 2,208 passengers and crew aboard, approximately 1,500 died (estimates vary), making the incident one of the deadliest peacetime sinkings of a single ship. The Titanic sank on 15 April 1912, after striking an iceberg during her maiden voyage. Numerous expeditions unsuccessfully tried using sonar to map the seabed in the hope of finding the wreckage. In 1985, the wreck was located by a joint French-American expedition led by Jean-Louis Michel of IFREMER and Robert Ballard of the Woods Hole Oceanographic Institution, which was made possible in part by support secured after successfully finding two nuclear Cold War submarines at the request of the US Navy.
