

Oats And Rolled Oats

Traditionally, the primary ingredient in muesli is rolled oats which have not been processed further. The original preparation was to soak the oats in water overnight (now commonly called "overnight oats") and eat them the next morning with fresh apple, nuts, lemon juice, and sweetened condensed milk. Over time, variations became commonplace, including the substitution of other citrus juices, the combining of additional ingredients, such as grains, seeds, and fresh and dried fruits, and the addition of yogurt, milk or other milk products or milk substitutes. These additions and substitutions are considered common ingredients in both homemade and commercially packaged muesli recipes.

Scott's Porage Oats The oats are rolled thicker than standard oats and are gently kilned to create what the company considers to be "the truest taste". In 1800, John McCann built a mill at Beamond, County Meath, near Drogheda in Ireland. In the 19th century, John McCann's Irish Oatmeal won several international prizes for the quality of its product and much of it was exported to the United States. John McCann Jr. merged with R. R. Hill of Drogheda in 1896. The Beamond Mill closed in 1898 and the company moved to Merchant's Quay in Drogheda. In the 20th century, McCann's increased exports of its oatmeal, notably to the United States and Canada. In 1964, the then family-owned Odlums Group acquired the business and transferred production to its oatmeal mill in Sallins, County Kildare, which had been in operation since 1910. In 2008, Sturm Foods acquired the McCann's Irish Oatmeal brand from Odlums, which by then was a wholly owned subsidiary of Origin Enterprises. TreeHouse Foods acquired the brand when they purchased Sturm Foods on 2 March 2010. On 16 July 2018, TreeHouse Foods sold the brand to B&G Foods for \$32 million.

Rolled whole oats, without further processing, can be cooked into a porridge and eaten as oatmeal; when the oats are rolled thinner and steam-cooked more in the factory, these thin-rolled oats often become fragmented but they later will absorb water more easily and cook faster into a porridge; when processed this way, they sometimes are marketed as "quick" or "instant" oats. It can be consumed in a variety of ways, most commonly with milk or water. The oat grains are dehusked by impact, and are then heated and cooled to stabilize the groats, the seed inside the husk. The groats may be milled to produce fine, medium, or coarse oatmeal. Porridge has been consumed in Scotland as a staple food since the Middle Ages, and is primarily consumed in the winter. A&R Scott began producing Scott's Midlothian Oat Flour in 1880, in Glasgow, moving to Edinburgh in 1909, and the distinctive name, Scott's Porage Oats, was adopted in 1914. They have been milled at the Uthrogie Mills at Cupar in Fife, Scotland, since 1947. Rolled oats are most often the main ingredient in granola and muesli. They can be processed further into a coarse powder, which breaks down to nearly a liquid consistency when boiled. Cooked oatmeal powder is often used as baby food.

The pieces can then be sold, or processed further to make rolled oat flakes, of smaller size than flakes of whole groats. Steel-cutting produces oatmeal with a chewier and coarser texture than other processes. They take longer to cook than instant, ground, or rolled oats, typically 15–30 Steel-cut oats (US), also called pinhead oats, coarse oatmeal (UK), or Irish oatmeal, are groats (the inner kernel with the inedible hull removed) of whole oats which have been chopped into two or three pinhead-sized pieces (hence the names; "steel-cut" comes from the steel blades)

Oat Oats grow thickly and vigorously, allowing them to outcompete many weeds, and compared to other cereals are relatively free from diseases. Oats appear to have been domesticated as a secondary crop, as their seeds resembled those of other cereals closely enough for them to be included by early cultivators. Oats tolerate cold winters less well than cereals such as wheat, barley, and rye, but need less summer heat and more rain, making them important in areas such as Northwest Europe that have cool, wet summers. diseases.
