== Causes of extinction ==

Queensland tiger theory of survival of the Tasmanian tiger or thylacine *Thylacinus cynocephalus*, a thylacinid, and also currently accepted as extinct, favour proposed survival In Australian folklore, the Queensland tiger is a creature said to live in the Queensland area in eastern Australia

Over five billion species are estimated to have died out. It is estimated that there are currently around 8.7 million species of eukaryotes globally, possibly many times more if prokaryotes are

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included. Notable extinct animal species include non-avian dinosaurs, saber-toothed cats, and mammoths. Through evolution, species arise through the process of speciation. Species become extinct when they are no longer able to survive in changing conditions or against superior competition. The relationship between animals and their ecological niches has been firmly established. A typical species becomes extinct within 10 million years of its first appearance, although some species, called living... 82da82d2cd Also known by a native name, yarri, it is described as being a dog-sized feline with stripes and a long tail, prominent front teeth and a savage temperament. It has been hypothesized to be a survivor or descendant of the large predatory marsupial Thylacoleo, officially considered to be extinct, or possibly a large feral cat variant (given possible discrepancies with thylacoleo dentition). In 1926 A. S. le Souef described a "Striped marsupial cat" in The Wild Animals of Australasia, this information later also included in Furred Animals of Australia, by Ellis Troughton, longtime curator of mammals in the Australian Museum. 82da82d2cd == Background

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The earliest documented witness reports of a Queensland marsupial tiger date from 1871, with indigenous traditions of the yarri preceding these. Many modern researchers, including Tim Flannery, think that with the arrival of early Aboriginal Australians, hunting and the use of fire to manage their environment may have contributed to the extinction of the megafauna. Increased aridity during peak glaciation (about 18,000 years ago) may have also contributed, but most of the megafauna were already extinct by this time. Others, including Steve Wroe, note that records in the Australian Pleistocene are rare, and there is not enough data to definitively determine the time of extinction of many of the species, with many of the species having no confirmed record within the last 100,000 years. Australian megafauna Most of these species became extinct during the latter half of the Pleistocene, as part of the broader global Late

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Quaternary extinction event. Most of these species became extinct during the latter half of the Pleistocene, as part of the broader global Australian megafauna which inhabited Australia during the Pleistocene Epoch. The roles of human and climatic factors in their extinction are debated

It is believed that Aboriginal Tasmanians became isolated from mainland Aboriginal groups around 11,700 years ago, when rising sea levels formed Bass Strait.

Pleistocene rewilding The wood bison, the closest relative of the ancient bison which became extinct in Siberia 1,000 to 2,000 years ago. Pleistocene rewilding is the advocacy of the reintroduction of extant Pleistocene megafauna, or the close ecological equivalents of extinct megafauna. It is an extension of the conservation practice of rewilding, which aims to restore functioning, self-sustaining ecosystems through practices that may include species

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reintroductions. sheep, Saiga antelope, and Siberian tigers
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Tasmania It is located 240 kilometres (150 miles) to the south of the Australian mainland, and is separated from it by the Bass Strait. It is Australia's smallest and least populous state, with 573,479 residents as of June 2023. 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De-extinction There are several ways to carry out the process of de-extinction. Similar techniques have been applied to certain endangered species, in hopes of boosting their genetic diversity. It is believed to have become extinct in the 20th century De-extinction (also known as resurrection biology, or species revivalism) is the process of human intervention to generate an organism that either resembles or is an extinct organism. The only method of the three that would provide an animal with the same genetic identity is cloning. There are benefits and drawbacks to the process of de-extinction ranging from technological advancements to ethical issues. commonly known as the Tasmanian tiger, was native to the Australian mainland, Tasmania and New Guinea. Cloning is the most widely proposed method, although genome editing and selective breeding have also been considered

Extinction This difficulty leads to phenomena such as Lazarus taxa, where a species presumed extinct abruptly "reappears" (typically in the fossil record) after a period of apparent absence. As a species' potential range may be very large, determining this moment is difficult, and is usually done retrospectively. Species become extinct when they are no longer able to survive in changing conditions or
