Temascalcingo The municipal seat is the town of Temascalcingo de José María Velasco. The temazcal was very common in Temascalcingo. It is known that the municipality of Tuxcueca was inhabited before the Spanish conquest; San Luis Soyatlán was founded by nomadic Chichimeca tribes who settled on the side of the river Las Cerretas. Some years before the conquest this region was invaded and governed by the King of the Purépecha, Tangaxoan Tzíntzicha who took over the coveted saltpetre fields of Zacoalco and Sayula. San Luis Soyatlán The locality of San Luis Soyatlán San Luis Soyatlán (pronounced [san 'lwis sojat'lan]) is a town located in the state of Jalisco in central-western Mexico, and is part of the municipality of Tuxcueca. == The town of Ixtlahuaca de Rayón == 4e3d93e6b0 Its name derives from two languages, from Spanish; "San Luis" which refers to the patronage of the saint of the population; Saint Louis of Toulouse, and the other "Soyatlán" which is Nahuatl meaning "place of soyates" (the fiber of soyate is the primary material for Mexican mats and hats). 4e3d93e6b0 The town had its origins when the residents of San Juan Palantla needed to escape an epidemic that devastated the village. First they established a village they called Valle Real; however, because of the place's bad location, they moved on to several farming areas called San Pedro Ozumasín, San Mateo Yetla and Santa María Jacatepec. Usually, colonias are assigned a specific postal code; nonetheless, in recent urban developments, gated communities are also defined as colonias, yet they share the postal code with adjacent neighborhoods. For example:. • El Pirul Santa Fe • El Pirul • El Pocito • In Mexico, the neighborhoods of large metropolitan areas are known as colonias. One theory suggests that the name, which literally means colony, arose in the late 19th and early 20th centuries, when one of the first urban developments outside Mexico City's core was built by a French immigrant colony. Unlike neighborhoods in the United States, colonias in Mexico City have a specific name which is used in all official documents and postal addresses. When writing a postal address the name of the colonia must be specified after the postal code and preceding the name of the city 4e3d93e6b0

When the town was officially established, the appendage of "de Rayón" was added to the name in honor of Francisco López Rayón who was executed there by royalist forces during the Mexican War of Independence on the side of the municipal palace. The original Mazahua town was located about 4 miles east of the current city. The population center was moved in 1545 when it was decided that the area needed a parish church of its own (it had been dependent on the parish of Tlalchichilpan prior), and the priest decided upon the location, finishing construction in 1552.
