Rakı It is often served with seafood or meze. Rakı has been a registered geographical indication in Turkey since 2009, granting it legal protection as a spirit produced exclusively from Turkish-grown grapes and anise. It is a national drink of Turkey, and it is especially popular in the coastal regions. The alcoholic content of rakı must be at least 40% according to Turkish standard. It is comparable to several other anise-flavored liqueurs such as pastis, ouzo, sambuca and arak. is an alcoholic beverage made of twice-distilled grape pomace and flavored with aniseed.
