Twelve-inch single The 12-inch LP sacrifices volume for extended playing time. It is named for its 12-inch (30 cm) diameter that was intended for LPs. They are played at either $33\frac{1}{3}$ or 45 revolutions per minute (rpm). This technical adaptation allows for louder levels to be cut on the disc by the mastering engineer, which in turn gives a wider dynamic range, and thus better sound quality. This record type, which is claimed to have been accidentally discovered by Tom Moulton, is commonly used in disco and dance music genres, where DJs use them to play in clubs.
