

What Is A Placebo

Molko and Olsdal were joined by drummer Robert Schultzberg for a demo, a split single, and their eponymous debut album in 1996. Shortly after the album's release, Steve Hewitt replaced Schultzberg on drums. Placebo gained exposure in 1997 after the single "Nancy Boy" (a song notorious at the time for its gender-bending content) became popular in the UK. The band stood out amongst the Britpop scene of the time because of their androgynous appearance and musical content, as well as Molko's distinctive voice and lyrics which openly discussed sexuality, mental health, and drug use. Their 1998 album *Without You I'm Nothing* was a massive international breakthrough, going platinum in the UK and gold in France. It spawned a pair of UK top-five singles for the band, "Pure Morning" and "You Don't Care About Us", as well as the No. 11 hit "Every You Every Me".

Amplified placebo effect The unblinding resulting in the effect is caused by subtle psychoactive effects and side effects of the active drug. Singer Brian Molko told *The Independent* that Placebo decided to cover "Life's What You Make It" because it's a 1980s song that the band still enjoys. In a placebo-controlled trial, any change in the control group is known as the placebo response, and the difference between this and the result of no treatment is the placebo effect.
