Bothrops Bothrops is a genus of highly venomous pit vipers endemic to the Neotropics. Currently, 48 species are recognized. They also occur on the islands of Saint Lucia and Martinique in the Lesser Antilles, as well as on Ilha da Queimada Grande off the coast of Brazil. The generic name, Bothrops, is derived from the Greek words βόθροϋ, bothros, meaning 'pit', and ὄψ, ops, meaning 'eye' or 'face', together an allusion to the heat-sensitive loreal pit organs. Members of this genus are responsible for more human deaths in the Americas than any other group of venomous snakes eb1dece12b

== Places == Ilha de São Sebastião Snake Island is the only natural home of the critically endangered, venomous golden lancehead pit viper (*Bothrops insularis*), whose diet consists of birds. The snakes became trapped on the island thousands of years ago, following the end of the last ice age, when rising ocean levels disconnected the island from the mainland. The ensuing evolutionary pressure allowed the snakes to adapt to their new environment, increasing rapidly in population and rendering the island dangerous to public visitation. The island is mostly covered with tropical rainforest. The main economic activity on the island is the production of açaí, followed by heart of palm, shrimp, oil seeds and small-scale agriculture. However, land conflicts take place on the island. It covers the 10 hectares (25 acres) Queimada Pequena and 23 hectares (57 acres) Queimada Grande islands in the Atlantic Ocean.
