For example, a person who recovers from the common cold is considered cured, even though they may contract another cold in the future. Conversely, a person who effectively manages a disease like diabetes mellitus to prevent undesirable symptoms... 1202e99cc6 As one of several modalities in the management of cancer, the specialty of surgical oncology has evolved in steps similar to medical oncology (pharmacotherapy for cancer), which grew out of hematology, and radiation oncology, which grew out of radiology. The Ewing Society—known today as the Society of Surgical Oncology—was started by surgeons interested in promoting the field of oncology. In 2011, the American Board of Surgery ratified Complex General Surgical Oncology via a specialty Board certification. The field was expected to continue expanding via the proliferation of cancer centers, as well as advanced minimally invasive

== Aminosalicylates == 1202e99cc6 In malaria, recurrence can take place due to recrudescence; or relapse; or re-infection (via mosquito transmission). Relapse means that a recurrence has been precipitated by a dormant stage in the liver called a "hypnozoite". Thus, relapse is applied only for those plasmodial species that have hypnozoites in the life cycle, such as *Plasmodium vivax* and *P. ovale*. On the other hand, recrudescence means that circulating, multiplying parasites are detected after having persisted in the bloodstream (or elsewhere) at undetectable levels for a period of time, as merozoites (as opposed to hypnozoites). Plasmodium species that are not associated with hypnozoite-mediated recurrences, such as *P. falciparum*, *P....* 1202e99cc6 Whether surgical oncology qualifies as a distinct medical specialty remains a topic of heated debate. Leukemia Diagnosis is typically made by blood tests or bone marrow biopsy. Signs and symptoms may include bleeding and bruising, bone pain, fatigue, fever, and an increased risk of infections. A lymph node biopsy can be performed to diagnose certain types of leukemia in certain Leukemia (also spelled leukaemia; pronounced loo-KEE-mee-ə) is a group of blood cancers that usually begin in the bone marrow and produce high numbers of abnormal blood cells. especially in the early stages of the disease or during remission. These symptoms occur due to a lack of normal blood cells. These blood cells are not fully developed and are called blasts or leukemia cells 1202e99cc6

The exact cause of leukemia is unknown. A combination of genetic factors and environmental (non-inherited) factors are believed to play a role. Risk factors include smoking, ionizing radiation, petrochemicals (such as benzene), prior chemotherapy, and Down syndrome. People with a family history of leukemia are also at higher risk. There are four main types of leukemia—acute lymphoblastic leukemia (ALL), acute myeloid leukemia (AML), chronic lymphocytic leukemia (CLL) and chronic myeloid leukemia (CML)—and a number of less common types. Leukemias and lymphomas both belong to a broader group of tumors that affect the blood, bone marrow, and lymphoid system, known as tumors of the hematopoietic... 1202e99cc6 Another method for determining the cure fraction and/or "cure time" involves measuring when the hazard rate in a diseased group returns to the hazard rate observed in the general population. 1202e99cc6

The cure fraction or cure rate—the proportion of people with a disease who are cured by a given treatment—is determined by comparing disease-free survival in treated individuals against a matched control group without the disease. 1202e99cc6

Management of Crohn's disease Since Crohn's disease is an immune system condition, it cannot be cured Management of Crohn's disease involves first treating the acute symptoms of the disease, then maintaining remission. However, the disease often returns even after surgery. Treatment initially involves the use of medications to eliminate infections (generally antibiotics) and reduce inflammation (generally aminosalicylate anti-inflammatory drugs and corticosteroids). However, surgery cannot cure Crohn's disease. involves first treating the acute symptoms of the disease, then maintaining remission. Since Crohn's disease is an immune system condition, it cannot be cured by medication or surgery. This involves removing the affected part of the intestine and reconnecting the healthy sections. Surgery may be required for complications such as obstructions, fistulae, abscesses, or if the disease does not respond to drugs within a reasonable time 1202e99cc6

Cure This may include a medication, a surgical operation, a lifestyle change, or even a philosophical shift that alleviates a person's suffering or achieves a state of healing. In complex diseases like cancer, researchers use statistical A cure is a substance or procedure that resolves a medical condition. The medical condition can be a disease, mental illness or genetic disorder. Related concepts with potentially differing meanings include response, remission, and recovery. cured 1202e99cc6

== Debate == 1202e99cc6 Once remission is induced, the goal of treatment becomes maintenance of remission: avoiding the return of active disease, or "flares". Because of side effects, the prolonged use of corticosteroids is avoided. Although some people are able to maintain remission spontaneously, many require immunosuppressive drugs. 1202e99cc6

Phobia Other symptoms can include fainting, which may occur in blood or injury phobia, and panic attacks, often found in agoraphobia and emetophobia. hand, in Agoraphobia as few as 10% of individuals are seen to reach complete remission without treatment. A study looking at the 2 year remission rates A phobia is an anxiety disorder, defined by an irrational, unrealistic, persistent and excessive fear of an object or situation. Phobias typically result in a rapid onset of fear and are usually present for more than six months. Around 75% of those with phobias have multiple phobias. If the object or situation cannot be avoided, they experience significant distress. Those

affected go to great lengths to avoid the situation or object, to a degree greater than the actual danger posed
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Phobias can be divided into specific phobias, social anxiety disorder, and agoraphobia. Specific phobias are further divided to include certain animals, natural environment, blood or injury, and particular situations. The most common are fear of spiders, fear of snakes, and fear of heights. Specific phobias may be caused by a negative experience with the object or situation in early childhood to early adulthood. Social phobia is when a person fears a situation due to worries about others judging them. Agoraphobia is a fear of a situation due to perceived difficulty... 1202e99cc6

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
