Despite the numerous ailments for which practitioners claim cupping therapy is useful, there is insufficient evidence demonstrating any health benefits. In March 1974, OAPEC lifted the embargo, but the price of oil had risen by nearly 300%: from US\$3 per barrel (\$19/m3) to nearly US\$12 per barrel (\$75/m3) globally.
