The song's author, Mitch Murray, offered it to Adam Faith and to Brian Poole but was turned down. George Martin of EMI, who felt the song had enormous hit potential, decided to pick it up for the new group he was producing, the Beatles, as the A-side of their first single. Many-worlds interpretation for how to define wave function branches in terms of quantum circuit complexity. Bryce DeWitt popularized the formulation and named it many-worlds in the 1970s. The evolution of reality as a whole in MWI is rigidly deterministic and dynamically local. As with the other interpretations of quantum mechanics, the many-worlds interpretation (MWI) is an interpretation of quantum mechanics that asserts that the universal wave function is objectively real, and that there is no wave function collapse. This implies that all possible outcomes of quantum measurements are physically realized in different "worlds". Many-worlds is also called the relative state formulation or the Everett interpretation, after physicist Hugh Everett, who first proposed it in 1957
