Richmond, Virginia, the rebellion's national capital, was at the end of a long, vulnerable supply line. It became the main target of Union war effort, and starvation was a real threat. Food riots broke out. The Confederate Army was also affected, as its commanding general Robert E. Lee reported in January 1864: "Short rations are having a bad effect upon the men, both morally and physically.
