Parvovirus B19 is a virus within the Parvoviridae family that causes disease in humans, especially in children. The most common disease derived from parvovirus B19 is fifth disease. This disease is spread in close contact through respiratory droplets, which can be from the nose, mouth, or direct contact with an infected person. Fifth disease is most commonly spread in the winter and spring seasons among children aged six to fourteen years old. Parvovirus B19 begins replicating anywhere from four to eighteen days after infection.
