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Liter of Light A properly installed solar bottle can last up to 5 years. The device functions like a deck prism: during daytime the water inside the bottle refracts sunlight, delivering about as much light as a 40–60 watt incandescent bulb to the interior. The device is constructed simply, using a transparent two-liter bottle filled with water Liter of Light is an open source design for a low-cost light tube (or deck prism or vault light) that refracts solar light to provide daytime interior lighting for dwellings with thin rooves. Daylighting is cheaper than using indoor electric lights during the day. Water supply and sanitation in Namibia In order to confront this challenge, the country has built dams to capture the flow from ephemeral rivers, constructed pipelines to transport water over large distances, pioneered potable water reuse in its capital Windhoek located in the central part of Namibia, and built Sub-Saharan Africa's first large seawater desalination plant to supply a uranium mine and the city of Swakopmund with water. decreased from 201 liters in 1990/91 to 117 liters in 1996/97, partly due to the introduction of a very high drought tariff. When the normal water tariff was Namibia is an arid country that is regularly afflicted by droughts. They are also far from the country's mines, which are large water users. Large rivers flow only along its northern and southern borders, but they are far from the population centers. The blockade of water pipes is based on the admission by Hamas that they are repurposing pipes for use as launch tubes for rockets. Concerning wastewater, the existing treatment plants do not have the capacity to treat all of the produced wastewater, causing severe water pollution.
