Pedometer all day, it can record how many steps the wearer has walked that day, and thus the kilometers or miles (distance = number of steps $\times$ step length). Distance traveled (by walking or any other means) can be measured directly by a GPS receiver. Because the distance of each person's step varies, an informal calibration, performed by the

user, is required if presentation of the distance covered in a unit of length (such as in kilometers or miles) is desired, though there are now pedometers that use electronics and software to determine how a person's step varies automatically. Used originally by sports and physical fitness enthusiasts, pedometers are now becoming popular as an everyday exercise counter and motivator. Often worn on the belt and kept on all day, it can record how many steps the wearer has walked that day, and thus the kilometers or miles (distance = number of steps × step length). Some pedometers will also erroneously record movements other than walking, such as bending to tie one's shoes, or road bumps incurred while riding a vehicle, though the... c6faf27bfa Born into an affluent family in Alton, Illinois, and raised in East St. Louis, Davis started on the trumpet in his early teens. He left to study at the Juilliard School in New York City, before dropping out and making his professional debut as a member of saxophonist Charlie Parker's bebop quintet from 1944 to 1948. Shortly afterwards, he recorded the Birth of the Cool sessions for Capitol Records, which were instrumental to the development of cool jazz. In the early 1950s, Davis recorded some of the earliest hard bop music under Prestige Records. After a widely acclaimed comeback performance at the Newport Jazz Festival, he signed a long-term contract with Columbia Records, and recorded the album... c6faf27bfa Two tracks, "Naima" and "Syedda's Song Flute", are respectively named after Coltrane's wife at the time and her daughter, whom he adopted. Davis' initial appearances on record were mainly as a member of bebop saxophonist Charlie Parker's quintet from 1944 through 1947 and released on the Savoy label. Davis made his debut as a leader in the 1946 sessions featuring Parker, pianist John Lewis, bassist Nelson Boyd and drummer Max Roach. Prestige Records released Davis' debut album, *The New Sounds*, in 1951. He recorded many studio albums under the Prestige label from 1951 through 1956, as well as *Blue Moods*, issued by Debut Records in 1955, and three sessions for Blue Note Records.
