Though the definitions vary, the commercial bank's reserves normally consist of cash held by the bank and stored physically in the bank vault (vault cash), plus the amount of the bank's balance in that bank's account with the central bank. In some areas such as the euro area and the UK, tightening of reserve requirements in the Reserve requirements are central bank regulations that set the minimum amount that a commercial bank must hold in liquid assets. A bank is at liberty to hold in reserve sums above this minimum requirement, commonly referred to as excess reserves. This minimum amount, commonly referred to as the commercial bank's reserve, is generally determined by the central bank on the basis of a specified proportion of deposit liabilities of the bank. Proximate cause The action is a necessary condition, but may not be a sufficient condition, for the resulting injury. Proximate cause is a key principle of insurance and is concerned with how the loss or damage actually occurred. Since but-for causation is very easy to show (but for stopping to tie your shoe, you would not have missed the train and would not have been mugged), a second test is used to determine if an action is close enough to a harm in a "chain of events" to be legally valid. intervening causes between an act and the resulting harm. A few circumstances exist where the but-for test is ineffective (see But-for test below). For example, in the case of a traffic collision, it could be established that if a car had not run a red light ("but for running the red light"), the collision would not have occurred. An intervening cause has several requirements: it must 1) be independent of the original act, 2) be In law and insurance, a proximate cause is an event sufficiently related to an injury that the courts deem the event to be the cause of that injury. Cause-in-fact is determined by the "but for" test: But for the action, the result would not have happened. There are several competing theories of proximate cause (see. Requirements elicitation is non-trivial because you can never be sure you get all requirements from the user and customer by just asking them what the system should do or not do (for Safety and Reliability).
