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Citron It is used in Asian and Mediterranean cuisine, traditional medicines, perfume, and religious rituals and offerings. It resembles a lemon, but is larger. Hybrids of citrons with other citrus are commercially more prominent, most notably lemons and many limes, which were created using citrons. Though citron cultivars take on a wide variety of physical forms, they are all closely related genetically. It is one of the original citrus fruits from which all other citrus types developed through natural hybrid speciation or artificial hybridization. (the thicker the better) is cut into pieces. for its edible, starchy corm. The plant has rhizomes of different shapes and sizes. Leaves are up to 40 by 25
centimetres (15+1/2 by 10 inches) and sprout from the rhizome. They are dark green above and light green beneath.
They are triangular-ovate, sub-rounded and mucronate at the apex, with the tip of the basal lobes rounded or sub-
rounded. The petiole is .8–1.2 metres (2+1/2–4 feet) high. The path can be up to 25 cm (10 in) long. The spadix is
about three fifths as long as the spathe, with flowering parts up to 8 millimetres (3/8 in) in diameter. The female
portion is at the fertile ovaries intermixed with sterile white ones. Neuters grow above the females, and are
