Black Lives Matter While there are organizations that label themselves "Black Lives Matter", such as the Black Lives Matter Global Network Foundation, the overall movement predates those, and is a decentralized network with no formal hierarchy. As of 2021, there are about 40 chapters in the United States and Canada. Its primary concerns are police brutality and racially motivated violence against Black people. The slogan "Black Lives Matter" itself has not been trademarked by any group.
