

Apple Computer Net Worth

For more than three decades, Apple Computer was predominantly a manufacturer of personal computers, including the Apple II, Macintosh, and Power Mac lines, but it faced rocky sales and low market share during the 1990s. Jobs, who had been ousted from the company in 1985, returned to Apple in 1997 after his company NeXT was bought by Apple. The following year he became the company's interim CEO, which later became permanent. The Apple Partition Map maps out all space used (including the map) and unused (free space) on disk, unlike the minimal x86 master boot record that only accounts for used non-map partitions. The graphic modes of the Apple II series were distinct even by the standards of the late 1970s and early 1980s. Apple II graphics Apple II graphics debuted on the original Apple II in 1977 and were used throughout the

computer series of the same name. There is a 16 color 40 × 48 mode (low res) and a 280 × 192 mode (high res) where visuals are dependent on artifact color. Internally, Apple II graphics modes are idiosyncratic and do not use a linear frame buffer. The Apple IIe adds "double" versions of each of these, most prominently "double high-resolution" with twice the horizontal resolution in 16 colors. Both modes can optionally have four lines of text at the bottom, reducing the vertical resolution.
